Purpose: Screen children to assess risk of oral disease; provide oral health education, topical fluoride, scaling/polishing and sealants, according to your child's individual needs.

Screening: All children will be seen for a two-minute screening to determine their risk of oral disease. If you do not wish your child to have this dental screening, please notify the school secretary or classroom teacher.

Consent: After the screening,
all children will be given a
consent form which will be
necessary for you to
complete and return before
services are provided.
Fees: There is no cost involved
as the preventive services are
covered by the School Dental
